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## Champions Again!

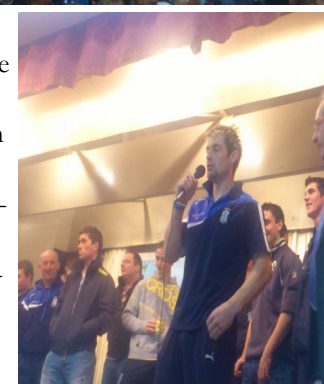
Kildalkey hurlers recently completed the coveted three-in-a-row for the first time in their illustrious history. On a miserable day in
